Humor, wit, and more than a passing familiarity with the absurd have all helped Jack Reznicki become one of the most sought-after illustrative and people photographers in New York City, and respected internationally. He may be best known for his expressive photographs of kids, or as he says, "Kids as kids".

Always insightful, entertainingly outspoken, and refreshingly candid, Jack will discuss in this far reaching session, his commercial and personal work and how they interact.

Jack has often said, "Be the photographer you are because of the way you think, not because you're someone with a camera." Come and see how Jack thinks and what he does with a camera. Jack will also have a Q&A at the end of his presentation. Never one to duck a hot question, these are always very illuminating, informative and entertaining sessions, for both new photographers and those shooting a lifetime themselves.

Jack's Bio

Jack Reznicki is a commercial people and children's photographer based in New York City for 30 years. His creative problem solving has helped promote products and services for many companies such as Toys "R" Us, Kodak, Reader's Digest, Tylenol, The Wall Street Journal, Hyatt, Crest, AT&T, Playtex, and several Time Magazine covers.

Jack is the author of several books on commercial photography including "Studio and Commercial Photography- A Kodak Pro Workshop" book.

He currently writes a column in Photoshop User Magazine called "The Copyright Zone". For over 4 years, Jack's insights into professional photography could be found in Petersen's Photographic magazine with his popular "Pro Vision" column. His writings have also appeared in other photography magazines. Jack has also been a popular lecturer and teacher around the country and internationally. As a member of Photoshop World's Dream Team instructors, his lighting concepts and copyright classes have always been popular.

Believing that photographers should be pro-active in the photo community, he has been very busy in that community. Jack is a former President of Professional Photographers of America (PPA). In the past Jack has served as President of the New York chapter of Advertising Photographers of America (APA), sat on the Joint Ethics Committee in New York, and served as Board Member of ASMP/NY.

Jack was appointed a guest professor at Shandong University of Art and Design in Jinan, China and is also a Mo-Tse Grand Master Photographer in China.

He is honored to be one of original "Canon Explorers of Light," an "Epson Stylus Pro" and host the Epson Print Academy's Track One, and a Sandisk "Photo Master". Jack has also does Beta testing and consulting with Canon, Epson, Mamiya, Microsoft, X-Rite, Leaf digital backs, and Adobe.

The Bike Shop by David Jeffery (1st Assigned print) is a multiple-exposure HDR (5 images processed with Photomatix). Canon 5DMk2 with Sigma 12-24 lens mounted on a tripod. Aperture 12 mm, ISO: 800. Shot around 5 pm using natural light.



Mud Rider by Jim Gold (1st place Color print) was shot with a Sony DSC-H7 digital camera at the finish line of the Saratoga race track around 6 pm on a cloudy day. Jim waited for the last day of the meet to get the fall foliage colors in the background and a late race to get the low sun.





Stalking the Shadows by Saul Aronson (1st place Monochrome print) was photographed with a Canon 40D and Canon 17-55 EF-S lens at Albany's Empire State Plaza in bright sunlight around 1 pm. Sepia toned in Photoshop.



Scroll and Song by Luba Ricket (1st place General Slide) shot with Pentax ME Super with a Vivitar I, 70-210 mm lens on Fuji 100 film, in natural indoor light.

Waiting for Restoration by **Kevin Sarsfield** $(2^{nd}$ place Assigned print) is an image of the Schodack Diner. Shot around 5 PM with available light. Fuji F20 camera with Fujinon 8-24 mm zoom lens. f/2.8 @ 1/60th sec. ISO: 400. Camera held stationary on counter; Self Timer utilized.



Wheel by Drue Sokol $(2^{nd} \text{ place Color})$ was taken at a car and truck rally in Clifton Park this summer. Canon 20 D with a Canon 28 - 135 mm lens. Star filter applied in Photoshop.

Digital Imaging Services by Jim Craner

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Two of a Kind by **Ken Deitcher** (3rd place Color print) was taken with a F20 Fuji point and shoot camera, hand held, in auto mode. Initially processed in Photoshop; further manipulations made in Topaz and an esoteric program that Ken is still experimenting with.

Rupert, Vermont by Ray Hull (1st place Assigned) was shot with an Olympus E-3 Zuiko 7-14 mm lens @14mm, near Merck Forest Preserve; f 8.0 @ 1/320 sec, ISO: 100.



After The Rain by Max Tiller (2nd place Assigned) was photographed with a Fuji S 8000 Point & Shoot, in Washington Park, Albany, after the Tulip Festival, on a Friday morning after a heavy rainstorm, so the tulips were bent over and still wet from the storm. Edited in Topaz Adjust 3. *Below:* **Summer Sirens** by Luba Ricket (3rd place Assigned).





The Gambler by Jack Hurley (1st place General).



Sunflower Sunset by Bill Lanahan $(2^{nd} \text{ place General})$ is two images (.5sec. @ f16 & 2sec. @ f16) selected from a 5 shot series bracketed at one stop apart. Bill selected one image for the sky and one for the foreground and blended them in Photoshop.



Covered Bridge by Ronald Ginsburg (3nd place General) was shot in late afternoon light in Sturbridge Village, MA. Canon 20D with Canon 70-200 mm f/4L lens, f/16 @ 1/50 sec, ISO: 400.
