VIDEO BASICS - Dow Smith - April 8th ~



Today, most DSLR cameras are capable of taking professional quality video but there is a difference between the art of shooting stills and the art of creat-

ing a movie. Through respect for each discipline and a strong knowledge of the strengths and weaknesses of each, ultimately we can learn how to weave these two art forms together to touch people in new and powerful

For the past 16 years Dow Smith has taught broadcast journalism at a several schools including Syracuse University and before that spent 25 years in television news. While most of his career was as a newscast producer or newsroom manager, he did learn a good deal about videography while working with some worldclass photographers and editors. Perhaps this evening's presentation will entice YOU to use the video feature in your camera!

ways that go beyond slides shows and YouTube clips. It is no longer just multimedia, but with a coherent plan and thoughtful execution stills and video can create powerful and memorable stories.

First, and most importantly, I'm going to look at video grammar. What is the fundamental difference between a still picture and motion pictures? How are they alike? What are the basic ingredients you need to create a visually articulate story? How do you avoid creating the most dreaded video of all: "the birthday party video."

Then I'll look at the *equipment*. What are the limitations of using a DSLR to shoot video? What kind of equipment do you need to overcome these limitations?

I'll conclude by looking at video editing basics and how to get beyond the pre-packaged slide show. How do vou blend video, stills and audio into a single story.



SPS Photo Essay Definition and Competition Rules 2014-15:

Definition:

The Photo Essay competition comprises three categories: print essay, projected essay and book essay.

Print essays are a collection of prints displayed in some fashion. Most typically they will be mounted on a board, but any method of presenting a collection of prints that can be physically managed by the entrant is allowable.

Projected essays are a collection of images that will be projected, not necessarily accompanied by a soundtrack. Presentation must be in a format that is compatible with the projection equipment available on the night of the competition and submitted at least the week prior to the photo essay competition.

Book essays are a collection of images assembled into a bound book such as are available on line from Shutterfly, Snapfish, Blurb and others or from a commercial business.

Rules:

- 1. One entry per person per category [print, projected, book].
- 2. Maximum length of a projected essay is 8 minutes. Suggested and preferred length is 3 to 5 minutes.
- 3. Participants are encouraged to use only their own images. Other images may be used only if they are vital to the narrative quality of the essay. Any images not made by the participant must be credited. No more than 10% of the total images may be non-participant images.
- 4. It is the participant's responsibility to know the rules. A submission outside of these guidelines will not be accepted.
- 5. Digital projected essays must be submitted no later than one meeting before the final competition night in order to ensure compatibility with the club's software






