Sarah Wigley graduated with a BFA in Photography from SUNY Potsdam in 2013. Sarah's work has been featured in publications such as *Time Out London*, *Time Out New York*, and *Creative Quarterly Magazine*. She also has more than 375 photographs featured on *Vogue Italia's* website, and was selected to be in an exhibition during Milan Fashion Week in 2012.

Sarah's love of travel grew after studying abroad in London. Since then, she has traveled to Italy, France, Scotland, Austria, and Germany. During her presentation on November 18th, Sarah will be speaking about her travels and offering insight into her photographing techniques. She will also be discussing the importance of "capturing the uncaptured" and creating an image that viewers want to know more about. Through this presentation Sarah hopes to inspire photographers to consider new and different ways to showcase cultures and cities, while still using the techniques of form, composition, line, etc.

PSA INTERCLUB COMPETITIONS



The new season of PSA Interclub Competitions has begun. There are five (5) categories in total, three competitions are open for November (see below). Key items to be taken into consideration as you consider submitting an entry:

- Check the PSA webpage for detailed info on each category.
- Each club may enter up to 6 images per competition from 6 different makers.
- Once an image has been entered into the Interclub Competition, it is ineligible for re-entry in this competition.
- Each image must have the following maximum size:

Horizontal images will be no more than 1024 pixels wide or 768 pixels tall.

Vertical images will be no more than 768 pixels tall.

- Save the file in jpeg format only. (There are no file size restrictions.)
- sRGB color space is recommended for optimum results.

PHOTOGRAPHING A DIFFERENT KIND OF FOOTBALL

Rugby, little-known in America, is one of the fastest, nonstop action sports I have ever seen. It is physical, it is aggressive and about relentless action. The principles of photographing the sport apply to any similar type of sports

photography. You need a camera that can crank off many frames per second, a good zoom telephoto lens so you can adjust for the various distances between you and the players, and appropriate camera settings to capture the action and the mood of this intense game

I used a Nikon D 7200 digital SLR with a Sigma 150-600 mm AF image stabilized lens, handheld, and was very happy with the results. My camera settings were ISO 800-1600 (depending upon the brightness of the light), shutter speed generally of 1/500th of a second, and aperture of F8. White balance was automatic.

Locally Albany has a rugby team called the Albany Knickerbockers and they play at the Dick Green Memorial Field off second Avenue at the Frisbie Avenue sports complex. The nice thing about the game is that there is no charge for attendance, the sidelines are relatively open as there are a few spectators, and you can see the players faces since they are not obscured by helmets or face masks. Intense expressions can therefore be captured. The rugby players are thrilled to have someone photograph them and email them the images.

If you like sports photography, this is one sport you should consider photographing.

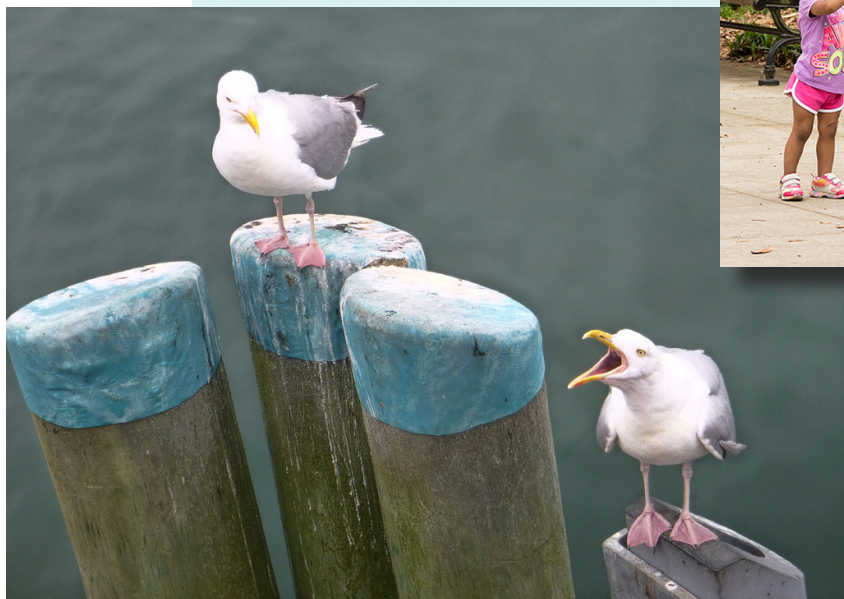

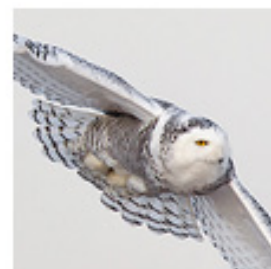
Attending Nature Visions will spark your interest in photography. All of the skilled photographers whose work is exhibited began as novices.

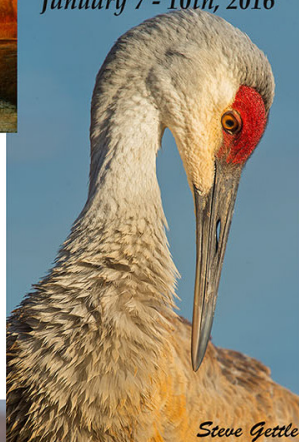

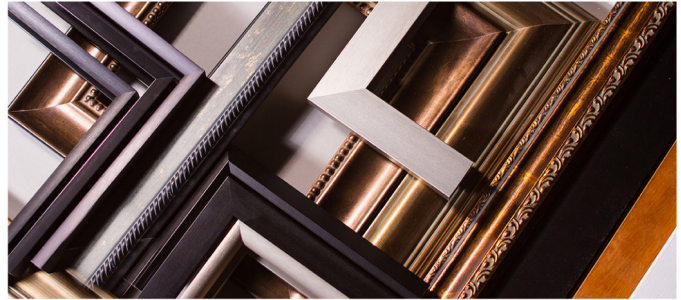

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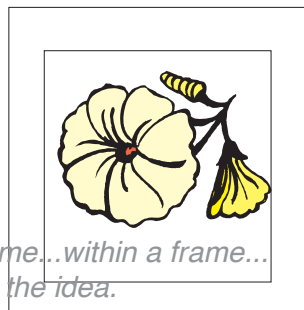
