# Jajja's Kids - January 20 by Connie Frisbee Houde with Diane Reiner and M-J Adelman




Speakers Night will be a discussion of how a non profit developed from a photographic Journey and how two good friends joined the Ugandan effort. We will hear from Diane Reiner as she shares her experiences and the development of Jajja's Kids, Inc., an all-volunteer, non-profit, independent organization, is dedicated to creating a home and building a family for children who are on their own. She will be joined by M-J Adelman and Connie Frisbee Houde both actively involved in the organization and who traveled to Uganda last year.

On her first trip to Uganda in 2006, Diane Reiner was introduced to 20-year-old Ronnie Sseruyange. Diane was in Uganda for a photography workshop Ronnie was her

guide when she wanted to document the lives of street children. Getting to know Ronnie, Diane was touched by his dedication to the children and moved by the difficulties facing them, She decided to work with Ronnie to make the children's lives better. And, Ronnie adopted Diane as his "Jajja" (grandmother).

Diane returned home and began to seek broader support for the work Ronnie was doing. She founded Jajja's Kids in the United States to raise money for the program Ronnie established in Kampala. Jajja's Kids, Inc., an all-volunteer, non-profit, independent organization, is dedicated to creating a home and building a family for children who are on their own.

The beginning of Ronnie Sseruyange story isn't just his story - it is the story of tens of thousands of children in Uganda today. At the age of 6, Ronnie became





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
# Jajja's Kids (Cont'd.)

Uganda, many of them migrating from the provinces to the capital city of Kampala. War, poverty, hunger and disease have forced them to fend for themselves in impossible circumstances. Mostly his grandmother raised Ronnie, and when she died, it left him alone with his mother who was terminally ill. Before she died, his mother told her six-year-old son he had to find his own way to his father's village. Not knowing how to heed his mother's instructions, Ronnie eventually found his way to Kampala. There he wound up on the alone on the streets.

Street children do not have an opportunity to go to school, because in Uganda formal education is not free, not even at the elementary level. So for the next ten years, Ronnie hung out with other street children and got an education of another sort—how to survive.

This is where Ronnie's story is different from most other street kids. At 16, he moved into a youth shelter and his life took a turn for the better. Although he was no longer living on the streets, Ronnie began helping other street kids who, like him, were orphaned or had lost contact with their families.

Fast forward with the assistance of Jajja's kids, in January 2013, Ronnie found a perfect house to rent and shorty thereafter. under the watchful eye of Ronnie, 14 former street children. ages 5-12, began living

together in a loving family environment. In 2014, three more boys joined the family.

Cared for by Ronnie and his staff, the boys now eat three meals a day, receive medical care when needed, sleep on bunk beds with real mattresses, and all attend primary school outfitted with school uniforms and book bag.



The house continues to grow in comfort, with the addition of books, bookshelves and donat-

ed computers. Tables and benches on which to eat and do homework were added along with a refrigerator that allows the boys to have a greater variety of food including fruit and vegetables.

In 2013 M-J Adelman joined Jajja's Kids board and Connie Frisbee Houde joined the advisory board.

Both M-J and Connie traveled to Uganda in March of 2015 to visit the boys.



Since the 1920's ambitious professionals, those whose work gets into museums, have steadily drifted away from lyrical subjects, conscientiously exploring plain, tawdry, or even vapid material."

#### JIM CRANER ~ "GIVING BACK" ~ Equine Advocates ~

Editor's Note: I saw our own Jim Craner instructing a group of photographers at an Equine Advocates' open house last fall. Being familiar with his wonderful work with this organization, I thought it would be great if he would provide an article for our newsletter. If you know Jim, you know he said, "Yes!"

At first glance Equine Advocates Rescue and Sanctuary looks like just any of the other horse properties dotting the landscape of northern Columbia County, New York. But this one is very different. Equine Advocates is home to upwards of 80 rescued horses, mules, and donkeys.

While each equine resident has an individual story, the common thread in each story is a life of mistreatment, neglect, and sometimes outright abuse. There are thoroughbreds 'off the track' due to poor performance or injury; American mustangs abruptly ripped from western public lands; an urban carriage horse scarred by years of wearing heavy tack and lame from walking on hard city pavement; mares kept constantly pregnant to produce urine used by the pharmaceutical industry in the production of hormone replacement therapy drugs. The list goes on.

Equine Advocates is a 501(3)(c) non-profit and annually struggles to raise the huge amount of money needed to maintain the 140 acre facility, and care for the equine residents who know it as home. Equine Advocates depends on the financial generosity of donors, and a large cadre of volunteers who provide a variety of 'pro bono' services including direct horse care, event organization, and public relations support. Equine Advocates publishes a huge volume of printed material, and has added a robust social media presence to its fund-raising efforts. All of this results in a never-ending need for high quality photo and video work.

I've been privileged along with my wife Marlene to be a part of the work at Equine Advocates for nearly 10 years. Horse owners ourselves, we find working



for Equine Advocates to be a natural extension of our love of horses. All the members of the Schenectady Photography Society have special skills that are desperately needed by any number of community-based organizations. Photography is among the most powerful tools for social, political, and environmental change. I urge all members of the Society to search out an opportunity to use your photographic talents to give back to a favorite organization whose mission and values you share.






#### PRINT JUDGE: Jim Craner

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


#### WEATHER ALERT!
