Lisa Cuchara, PhD, HonNEC, is very passionate about photography, and she enjoys both being behind the lens and in the digital darkroom. She loves to photograph nature, but finds many subjects equally intriguing. From birds and flowers to babies and HDR, she appreciates the world around her and embraces the challenge of interpreting what her eyes see and her heart feels via her photographs. Lisa says that photography allows her to pay attention to the details, to be mindful, to slow down and appreciate all of the beauty, details and nuances of everyday life.

Lisa's mantra is: "Creativity is contagious, pass it on!" On September 23rd, be inspired and learn how to be creative in your camera and in your post-processing: long exposures, multiple exposures, overall creativity in camera and in post-processing (plugins, HDR, and textures), creative focusing (bokeh, soft focus, focus stacking), camera movement (panning, rotate), neutral density, Bulb setting, white balance, filters, panoramas, perspective, composites, plugins, HDR, double tone mapping, textures, and more!

Lisa and her husband Tom are both very active in many local, national, and international photography organizations. They have been photographing people professionally for over 15 years and have their own Photography Studio in Hamden, CT. Their portrait philosophy is based on "We do not remember days, we remember Moments."

10:30-12:30: Layers and Masks: "Masking Your Way to a Better Photograph"

Learn about adjustment layers and masking. Expand your post-processing capabilities by learning about LAYERS, the heart of Photoshop, and MASKS, the soul of Photoshop. "White Reveals, Black Conceals: Masking Your Way to a Better Photograph." Selective editing will make your photographs POP! Adjustment layers and filters can be applied to an entire image at full or reduced opacity, but sometimes you just want to tweak a particular part of an image, which is where masks come in. The advantage of using layer masks is that you can refine both the effect and the area being affected at any point (even after you save and re-open an image). Lisa will demonstrate "nondestructive" editing in Photoshop and will show you how to use layers and masks to enhance your images. Selective editing can be used for making adjustments to exposure and contrast, for non-destructive dodging and burning, for blurring the background, for selective coloring, focus, or sharpening, for extended and high dynamic range (EDR and HDR). This program will focus on the concept of layers and masks and the application of masks to enhance your photographs. White reveals, black conceals, and shades of gray provide a variety of opacities -- masking is essential for anyone using the digital darkroom to enhance their images!

1-4:30: "The Creative Use of Blend Modes in Photoshop"

Unleash the power and creativity of blend modes! Layers and masks are the heart and soul of Photoshop, but blending modes are the spice to allow you to blend layers together to create effects. Have some fun with your photographs and come join Lisa as she shows you how Blend Modes will enhance your creativity. There are more than two dozen different blend modes which will be discussed, and the most popular ones will be demonstrated live. Changing the blending modes alters the way that particular photograph or layer or texture interacts with the photograph underneath. Be creative and experiment -- try different modes and use various Fill Opacities until you get the creative results you're looking for.

Lisa will show you how to use the multiply and screen blend modes for compositing; the lighten and screen blend modes for night photography; the multiply and screen blend modes for exposure alterations, and for more effective, non-destructive dodging and burning. She will also demonstrate the use of the popular soft light, overlay and multiply for textures.



NECCC 2016 AS SEEN THROUGH MY IPHONE by Linda Tommasulo

This was only my third year at NECCC, and I continue to be inspired by all of the great presentations that are available. Since the first presentation I attended this year was "My Favorite iPhone Photography Applications" by Karen L. Messick, I decided to continue the conference taking iPhone images to share in the newsletter. I'll also include a few of the great tips I learned from a host of wonderfully-talented fellow photographers.

Friday, 1 pm "My Favorite iPhone Photography Applications" Karen L. Messick (MD)

Karen takes most of her photos in Hipstamatic. A few cool apps that I want to try: Slow Shutter Cam (by Cogitap), Stackables, Layered Texture Effects (by Sam Azzam), Image Blender (by Johan Anderson) and Glaze (by Giles Dezeustre).

Friday, 2:30 pm - "The Fine Art Print" - John Gregor

John's fine art prints begin before he taps the shutter, and ends as the image is coming out of his Canon Pro 1000 Printer. He prefers Moab paper. His most important message: the image on your screen will never match the print. Always make test prints (8 x 10) and adjust as needed for your final image.




Friday, 4 pm - "Studio Pet Photography" - Larry Cowles

Great pet photos don't just happen. Larry carefully plans and sets up his photo sessions. His best tip: It takes three people to get good images - the photographer, the wrangler and the teaser.

(I'm not interested in setting up a pet photography studio...

I just wanted to see the cute pet photos!)



You should remember Jim from his SPS presentation on Arcadia last season. His message: "Mix your imagination with your digital captures" by compositing. Jim made it look easy using layers and blend modes (Darker color, Luminosity or Soft Light), and adjusting the opacity. Best advice: try it!



Friday, 8:30 pm - "Seascapes" - Mark Bowie

If you attended our kick-off in 2014, you know what a great photographer Mark Bowie is. Mark plans his shoots by doing his homework (research, forecasts, etc.) and masters composition, light and shutter speed to create his seascape masterpieces.

Saturday, 8:30 am - "The Art of Bird Photography" - Peter Cristoph

A few tips from nature photographer, Peter Cristoph: The background is as important as the subject; always respect the subject and its habitat; and follow the three P's - Patience, Persistence and Perseverance.

Saturday, 10am - "Creating Visual Narratives Using Time/Motion Techniques" Deborah Sandidge



Deborah captivated us all with her presentation on time lapse, stop-motion time lapse, cinemagraph, long exposure, 2D animation and more, She loves the Singh-Ray Gold-Blue Polarizer.



Saturday, 11:30 am - "Abstracts with Impact" - Mollie Isaacs

Per Mollie, Abstract Photography is an art form that uses Shape, Form, Color and Line. To begin, start by looking at the big picture, and then narrow your view. It is amazing that abstract photography is all around us...all you have to do is look and shoot!

Saturday, 2 pm - "Strategies for Capturing Decisive Moments in Nature" Joe LaFevre

I must say that Joe's presentation was my favorite. (Not just mine...he got a standing ovation!) Joe talked about planning his shoots well in advance (map and scout the location), return and wait for the quintessential moment, match the light to the landscape, search for special conditions and use time-lapse and video to capture the decisive moment.

Saturday, 3:30 pm - "The 5 Essential Elements to Great Photography - (and the 8 Not So Essential)" - David Middleton

I was really pleased when David said he takes his best photos close to home. Here are his 5 essential elements: 1) Step back, anticipate and focus on background; 2) Patience & persistence; 3) Solid technique; 4) Pretty light; 5) Knowledge.

Saturday, 8:15 pm - Keynote: "Earth is My Witness" - Art Wolfe

I cannot begin to describe the amazing stories and fantastic images in Art Wolfe's keynote presentation. We were all mesmerized, and many of us purchased his retrospective book...which weighs about 10 pounds!

Sunday, 9 am - "Social Media for Photographers" - Joe Edelman

I discovered I am NOT taking full advantage of social media to promote my photography! Joe's general tips: Be social; post regularly; treat others as you wish to be treated; be accessible; provide value - and hashtag!



Sunday, 10:30 am - "Smart Photo Editor" - Mike Moats

If you enjoy putting an "artistic spin" on your images, Smart Photo Editor may be for you. With a plethora of effects, you can turn a hohum image into a work of art. And at \$29 for the stand-along program, why not give it a try?



Sunday, noon - "Dynamics of Nature Photography" - John Slonina

As we heard earlier in the weekend, great nature photographs don't just happen. Among many other tips, John suggested you do your research; take notes to improve future trips; plan with your GPS; build a network (i.e. rangers, hotel staff, etc.); take advantage of the weather and conditions and practice Patience and Persistence!




