Ken Bovat, Jr., Master Photographer and Craftsman, is the owner and sole photographer of Photo-Art by Ken Bovat, in Claverack, New York. He began his business in 1976, photographing mostly weddings and environmental portraits, working out of his home. As his business grew, Ken relocated to an old railroad depot, which he converted into his current studio. His photography consists of weddings, portraits—specializing in high school seniors—and a small amount of commercial photography.

Ken received his Master of Photography degree from the Professional Photographers of America in 1988, and his Photographic Craftsman degree in 1992. In 1998, Ken received the PPA National Award from the Professional Photographers' Society of New York, where he served as president from 2003-2004. He is the recipient of numerous photographic awards on the

local, state and international level; and he has lectured and given demonstrations to many photographic groups, both professional and amateur.

Although Ken's work is primarily portraits, he doesn't stop there. I have witnessed his masterful images both in portraiture as well as nature and landscapes. In fact, there is no subject that Ken won't tackle; and his creativity and technical expertise is evident time after time.

On October 26th, Ken will discuss "The Psychology and Language of Color": some helpful hints to tell a better story by using the right color at the right time. In his presentation he will show different types of color compositions and will link the different types to portraits.

These may include service to PSA or other photographic organizations or photography related service to the general community. While a high degree of photographic proficiency and achievement are often evident, personal achievement alone does not qualify a candidate for this honor. A Candidate for this honor must be a member in good standing for at least six consecutive years. A majority vote by the eight members of the Honors Committee is required for the Candidate to be elected an Associate.

TEACHING A WORKSHOP ABOUT THE BASICS OF COMPOSITION (IN KOREA!) ...What Did I Learn?

The semesters end was approaching and that means break time. All of the Korean teachers were heading out across, China, Mongolia, Russia, etc., and a few back to Korea for their holiday. Nearly all of them had families and an adventurous spirit to some degree. After all they decided to come to China, where just about everything is different, even from Korea and Japan. And if there is one thing that Koreans love other than K-pop, fried chicken and beer, Arirang, and Korean food...it is their phones. And they got big ones too! Some seem to make tablets diminutive. Video games become top priority on those big screens, but second, especially for moms and dads, is the camera. So why not give a short tutorial on composition before break? And that is what I did.

Many of them did not speak English, so with a little help from a Korean, key words were translated into Hangul. More than that, this was a photo lesson, not history, so words could easily be replaced by body theatrics and a little presentation creativity. The showing was good for the first days presentation, but the second day's practicum really drew a crowd. Those phones have social media, and they were used.

For them, they received some new ideas and many created some really cool photos. But in the end I think I may have gotten more out of it than they did. After all I am the one who loves photography.

The following are a few simple things that I took away from teaching.

- 1. Helping others achieve success. Seeing people smile when they couldn't believe that they produced an image they were proud of was a real joy. It is great fun to encourage others and to get real instant feedback for the work you put in, is really validating and rewarding.
- 2. Spreading knowledge of photography. As more cameras are out there, more great images can be captured. With a little know how I am happy that memories are not only being created but can be savored for the future.
- 3. Helping to make every digital pixel be at its best. So putting a dent in the digital garbage felt good. Not a judgment, but just too much information of all kinds is out there on the net. And that includes pixels. I wonder about the pixel count to value ratio that is on the net these days. Helping to make every digital pixel be at its best.
- 4. And for me, it was great to go through my images to see how I have progressed, regressed, and rebounded from my experiences with cameras. Did I practice what I was about to preach? I think not as much as I should. Progress, not perfection!

Who is Branson Quenzer?

For over a decade, Branson has chased bygone eras in a vastly changing Chinese landscape,,,getting a final glimpse of the simple ways of the peasants and the countryside's of NE China before the economic boom sweeps them away. Beyond NE China, Branson also spends an inordinate amount of time traveling without a destination, rather a general direction guided by instinct.

Branson has a Master's Degree in Economics giving him a concept of seeing the world through a system of interlinking processes and changes which he explores in his photography and art. He is originally from New Mexico.

"In any group there is always a teacher amongst it"—Confucius said... And that is certainly true for my life here in Harbin. One moment I am learning and another I am the teacher. That is one of the main reasons that I stay in China, its dynamism. Studying political economy is more than class, it is a way of looking at life and investigating your surroundings. So how long does it take to get to know all of Harbin? My answer would

be that it changes just faster than your ability to comprehend it. These days I spend most of my time in two places, Daowai and Nangang. Nangang has the best university (HIT) and Daowai has the best food. Both have lots of Harbin history and culture, and both give me ample opportunity to use my extra time pursuing my favorite hobby after traveling—taking photos.



Negative Space

The digital diary of my experience here has helped me chronicle the changes I have seen in Harbin and the changes that have happened in me. Enjoying the vast cultural opportunities, historical perspectives, and predictions of what might be gives me new and fascinating ways of seeing the same thing from inside and out, from the left or right or from what was to what it may be. After many years of being here and many years of traveling out there, I am happy to call Harbin home. "I will drag my tail in the mud!"—Zhuangzi


