



Can Mark capture a moment like no other? Yes, he can. He's the s**t.


> Is Mark 6' 3" or 4'11"? Meet him and you'll find out.

Some of our long-term members may be familiar with our judges. In fact, Fran indicated she took first and third places in our original smartphone competition "back in the day."

Vincent Giordano has always been interested in photography. As a child he loved his Polaroid camera. His serious pursuit of the image started out at age 19 with a Minolta X-700 SLR that he got as a wedding gift from his brother-in-law. He used the camera on a regular basis teaching himself photography. At 25 he was working as a warehouse manager and was a serious photo hobbyist. He was injured on the job and found himself with a lot of time on his hands and a very small income. He decided to go to college.

Vincent graduated from SUNY New Paltz with a BFA in Photography a few years later. And a short time after that he earned an MFA from Visual Studies from Visual Studies Workshop, Rochester, NY. While in graduate school he worked part time in a service bureau where he learned digital imaging. One of the highlights of his grad-



uate program was learning lenticular imaging. He not only taught himself this but mastered it and used it in his graduate thesis. Fran Giordano started taking pictures in high school. It was one of many art classes. She continued to take photos throughout her college career, although she focused on it in a more serious way in



graduate school. She earned a BS in Art education from SUNY New Paltz, and an MFA from Visual Studies from Visual Studies Workshop, Rochester, NY.

After graduating with their masters degrees Vincent and Fran moved to the Capital region to settle down. Vincent has worked in the marketing industry as a photographer and currently works for the College of St. Rose. They have shown work periodically though out the Capital region. This year they celebrated 27 years of marriage, have one 10 year old son and live in Schenectady NY.

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




